Some 300 teachers and administrators from Ohio and Michigan are expected to attend the College of Education's fifth annual conference at the University of Toledo Friday (April 7.)

Theme of this year's conference will be "The Role of the School in Meeting the Needs of the Unmotivated Non-Academic Student." Keynote talks will be given by Dr. Elizabeth Drews, associate professor, College of Education, Michigan State University, and Dr. Daniel Schreiber, department of school drop-outs, National Education Association.

Conference sessions will be held in Dana Auditorium of the Engineering-Science Building, beginning with registration and a coffee hour at 9 a.m. TU President William S. Carlson and Education Dean George E. Dickson will welcome participants at the opening session at 10 a.m. Dr. Drews and Dr. Schreiber will speak from 10:15 to 11:45 a.m.

Following a noon luncheon, conference participants will meet in group discussion sessions of elementary teachers, administrators, school counselors, secondary teachers, school social workers, visiting teachers and school psychologists. Dr. Drews and Dr. Schreiber will evaluate the discussion periods at a general closing session at 2:15 p.m.

Dr. Drews is a former director of psychological services in the Lansing, Michigan, Public Schools and is currently directing research under grants from the U. S. Office of Education and the National Defense Education Act. She was named in a national poll of educators as the leading authority in her field.

Dr. Schreiber is chairman of the education committee of the President's Committee on Juvenile Delinquency and Youth Crime, director of an NEA project on school drop-outs and a consultant to the Ford Foundation and the Carnegie Corporation.
