Formal dedication of Carter Hall, new men's dormitory at the University of Toledo will be held at 4:30 p.m. on Saturday, October 17. The ceremonies will follow the TU-Bowling Green State University Homecoming football game in TU's Glass Bowl, according to Arthur H. Black, TU's dean of men who is chairman of the dedication committee.

The hall is dedicated to Dr. Raymond L. Carter, who was on the TU faculty for 27 years and who died in 1950. He served as professor of education, director of the Junior College, dean of administration and, in 1947-48, as acting president.

Dean Carter was the founder of Arx, now Blue Key, men's honor fraternity at TU. During World War II, Dean Carter corresponded with hundreds of TU students who were in military service and later helped them resume their college work.

A portrait of Dean Carter will be unveiled at the dedication by his widow, Mrs. Rose Carter, 2427 Middlesex Dr. Speakers at the dedication will include Dr. William S. Carlson, TU president; Mayor John W. Potter; Donald S. Parks, dean of students; Harry Pettigrew, president of TU's Student Senate; and Andrew Taddei, a representative of the Carter Hall residents.

The dedication committee includes: Edward Schmamel and Mr. and Mrs. Harry Parke, alumni representatives; Dean Black, Mr. Pettigrew, Melvin Klein and Elliot Edelstein, student representatives; William Wood, dormitory manager; and Jerry L. Morrow.

Carter Hall residents will serve as guides for an open house in the dormitory following the dedication.
