The annual President's Review by The University of Toledo Reserve Officers' Training Corps will be held at 12:15 p. m. on Wednesday, November 2, on TU's front campus.* The 775 cadets and ROTC's 11 coed sponsors will honor Dr. William S. Carlson, TU president.

Nine senior ROTC students will receive Distinguished Military Student awards for demonstrated academic and military capabilities. Additionally, Veterans Memorial Scholarship awards will be presented to one student from each of the sophomore, junior and senior classes.

The Distinguished Military Student awards will go to Howard B. Camp, John A. Graham III, Richard L. Kelley, Alan R. Knowles, Eugene F. Shurtz, Jr., Michael W. Strand, and Steven C. Trabbic, all of Toledo; James S. Rabbitt, Oregon, Ohio and Russell C. Cronin, Cleveland.

Veterans' Memorial Scholarship recipients are Mr. Shurtz, a senior; John R. Giger, a junior; and Jeffery A. Black, a sophomore, all of Toledo.

The scholarship awards will be presented by Mrs. R. N. Blough of the Veterans' Memorial Scholarship Association. Mrs. Blough and a group of women formed the association to provide a fund for sons of TU graduates who lost their lives while serving with the U. S. armed forces during World War II. Since all eligible students have completed their college work, the fund has been made available to TU students enrolled in the Reserve Officers' Training Corps program.

The scholarship selection was based on each student's academic achievements, extracurricular activities, and honorary awards received during the previous school year.

Mr. Black, the sophomore scholarship winner, is the son of Arthur H. Black, dean of men and associate professor of chemistry at TU.

The ROTC sponsors represent the eight companies, two battalions, and the corps brigade.

Following the review an ROTC open house will be held in the ROTC armory.
