Approximately 712 candidates will receive degrees at The University of Toledo's 84th academic year commencement to be held Thursday (June 8) at 4 p.m. in the TU Field House.

Dr. William S. Carlson, president, will present the diplomas and deliver the commencement address.

Largest graduating class in TU's history, it also will be the last for the University as a municipal institution since it will become a state university on July 1. In recognition of the occasion, a citation honoring the citizens of Toledo for their support and interest in the University over the years will be presented to the City of Toledo through Mayor John W. Potter.

TU's 25th anniversary class of 1942 will be represented by Dr. Edward Shapiro, a member of the faculty of Wayne State University, who will join the TU faculty in the department of economics in September.

Candidates for doctoral degrees are James C. Stull and Beverly White Miller, doctor of philosophy, and Edward G. Johnson, Jr., doctor of education. The doctor of jurisprudence degree will be awarded to 34 graduates of the College of Law. Helen Sefferly is a candidate for a sixth-year certificate in guidance and counseling.

There are 122 candidates for master's degrees; 396 for bachelor's degrees; two for associate degrees in the College of Business Administration, and 154 for associate degrees in the Community and Technical College.
