A faculty committee to seek candidates for the deanship of The University of Toledo's College of Arts and Sciences has been appointed by Dr. William S. Carlson, TU president.

Named to the committee were: Dr. Michael Manheim, professor of English and chairman of the English department; Dr. John Turin, professor of physics and chairman of the physics department; and Dr. Julian Wohl, professor of psychology and chairman of the psychology department. University Professor and Provost G. Ernst Giesecke, the University's chief academic officer, is chairman of the faculty committee.

Dr. Giesecke noted that Professors Manheim, Turin and Wohl represent the three divisions of the College of Arts and Sciences -- humanities, natural sciences and social sciences, respectively.

In establishing the committee, Dr. Carlson gave it the charge "to make a careful assessment of the needs of the College of Arts and Sciences, to seek the strongest candidates available, and to recommend from among them several suitable candidates."

The committee has begun its deliberations and plans to continue to work actively throughout the summer.

"The great progress which has been made in strengthening the College of Arts and Sciences during the tenure of retiring Dean Jerome W. Kloucek demands that the committee seek out men of substantial accomplishment and stature," Dr. Giesecke said. "To provide the requisite leadership for the faculty in the arts and in the sciences and to serve as their effective spokesman in the University and the community is a very great challenge, and the committee will make its recommendations after conducting a nationwide search."

Dr. Kloucek has served as dean of the college since 1962. His resignation becomes effective Sept. 1, 1967. Named acting dean, also effective Sept. 1, 1967, is Dr. Noel Leathers, who currently is chairman of TU's history department.
