The annual President's Review by The University of Toledo Reserve Officers' Training Corps cadet brigade will be held at noon on Wednesday (November 1) on TU's front campus.* Dr. William S. Carlson, TU president, will present Distinguished Military Student awards to 18 senior ROTC cadets during the review. Also, Veterans' Memorial Scholarship awards will be presented to two students from each of the sophomore, junior and senior classes.

The Distinguished Military Student awards are presented to cadets with demonstrated academic and military capabilities. Recipients are Thomas J. Beutler, Larry L. Brookhart, Ronald J. Crocker, John A. Flynn, John R. Giger, Myron E. Hatcher, Raymond R. Hayes, William J. Helf, William H. Kaufmann, John F. Mueller, Thomas H. Olivo, Lawrence T. Parrish, Frank E. Pasko, Michael H. Peterson, Harry W. Porthouse, John L. Ross, Jeffrey A. Scott and Floyd A. Steward.

The scholarship awards will be presented by Mrs. H.E.Youngs and Mrs. R.N. Blough of the Veterans' Memorial Scholarship Association. Recipients are: Thomas J. Beutler and John R. Giger, seniors; Jeffrey A. Black and Peter F. Sun, juniors; and James R. Wittman and Donald B. Anthony, sophomores. Selection was based on each student's academic achievements, extracurricular activities and honorary awards received during previous school years.

Mrs. Youngs, Mrs. Blough and a group of women formed the Veterans' Memorial Scholarship Association to provide a fund for sons of TU graduates who lost their lives while serving with the U.S. armed forces during World War II. Since all eligible students have completed their college work, the fund has been made available to TU students enrolled in the Reserve Officers' Training Corps program.
