Some 764* University of Toledo students are summer quarter candidates for graduate, baccalaureate, and associate degrees to be conferred at individual college commencement ceremonies Saturday, Aug. 21, on the main and Scott Park campuses.

They include 25 candidates for the doctor of philosophy degree, 3 for the doctor of education degree, 1 for the doctor of philosophy degree in engineering science, 15 for law degrees, 11 for the education specialist degree which requires a year's graduate study beyond the master's degree, 216 for master's degrees, 376 for bachelor's degrees, and 117 for associate degrees.

Two of the graduates will be receiving degrees summa cum laude reflecting accumulated grade point averages of at least 3.9 on a 4 point scale. They are Barbara A. Mann (2016 Scottwood Ave.), earning a bachelor of arts degree in the University College who also will serve as that college's valedictorian, and Yvonne Mary Spitulski (948 Annabelle Dr.), earning a bachelor of business administration degree in the College of Business Administration.

The individual college commencement ceremonies, their times, and locations follow:

-- The College of Education and Allied Professions at 10 a.m. in the Student Union auditorium. Dr. George E. Dickson, dean of the college, will address remarks to graduates and University Trustee John D. Anderson will confer degrees.

-- The University College at 10 a.m. in the auditorium of the Continuing Education Center. Catherine A. Piper, administrator of the Eberly Center for Women at UT, will deliver the commencement address and UT Trustee Warren E. Buckley will confer degrees.

-- The University Community and Technical College at 10 a.m. in the main concourse of the Scott Park campus. Phillip A. Sinclair, professor of business technologies, will deliver the commencement address and Crystal Bauerschmidt, Sarah Gorrell, and Kathleen McHugh will speak as co-valedictorians. UT Trustee Harold D. Leu will confer degrees.

-- The College of Business Administration at 12:30 p.m. in the Student Union auditorium. Stanley R. Hesselbart, president of the Sylvania Savings Bank, will deliver the commencement address and Diana Pribis the valedictory address. Newly named UT Trustee William D. Keip will confer degrees.

-- The College of Arts and Sciences and the College of Pharmacy in a joint ceremony at 2:30 p.m. in the Student Union auditorium. Dr. Sidney J. Kaplan, chairman of the University's department of sociology, anthropology and social work, will deliver the commencement address. Dr. Glen R. Driscoll, president of the University, will present a charge to the graduating class and will confer degrees.

-- The College of Engineering at 2:30 p.m. in the Continuing Education Center auditorium. Dr. William N. Free, the University's vice president for academic affairs, will deliver the commencement address and John Rose, candidate for the bachelor of science degree in chemical engineering, will speak on behalf of the graduates. Dr. Free will confer degrees.

-- The College of Law at 2:30 p.m. in the Law Center auditorium. Dr. Robert S. Sullivant, the University's executive vice president, will address the graduates and Richard Altman, candidate for the juris doctor degree, will deliver the valedictory address. Dr. Sullivant also will confer degrees.

The University of Toledo conducts commencement ceremonies four times each year at the conclusion of the summer, fall, winter, and spring quarters.
