 has been planned.

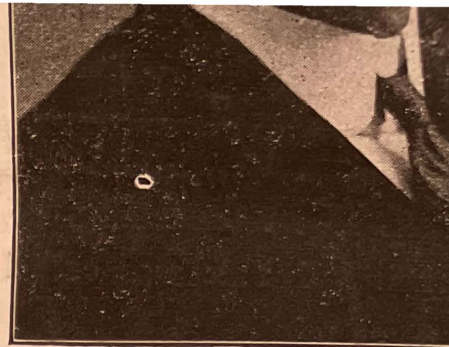
At 8:30 A. M. the boat will
