Had to letters from you last
nite so thought I would write

with this other letter. So Tom
didn't get his furlough. Did
he say why they changed
it. Our company commander,
St. Wilson went home yesterday
on furlough. He will be back
in about three months he
said. We have only one officer
left in the company now. We
did have five but one was

Killed and the others got transferred.
So they can't get the price to
my watch. How long will it be before
they start making them.

I went to a U.S.O. show at the
village of Taloma outside of Davao
last nite. It was a three act.
play about Henry Aldrich, called what
a life. The people who played in
it sound about like them when
they were over the radio. We went
by convey down there and it was
quite a ways ~~down there~~. The road
is pretty good most of the way. They
have a paved road in Davao. That
was the first one I've saw since
we left the States.

You asked if I had got paid
yet and I have twice. I think I
will leave my bonds stopped. What
do you think about it. Think I'll
close for now. So - long for this
