We wish to call your attention to the following notice to be posted on our plant bulletin boards:

"On June 28, 1940, the 76th Congress of the United States enacted a law (H.R. 5138) known as the 'Alien Registration Act of 1940'. It requires aliens, whether in the United States for a number of years or for short duration, to register and be fingerprinted at the post offices in their residential localities. The records are to be forwarded to and maintained by the U.S. Department of Justice by the Post Office officials. Between August 28 and December 26, 1940, all aliens in the United States are to be registered. It should be noted that the status of an alien does not change until he receives his final citizenship papers.

Aliens now employed by the duPont Company are requested to comply promptly with this new law."
