- member of Pi Gamma Mu, National Social Science Honor Society; Ohio State Bar Association, Stark County Bar and Law Library Associations; former board member Canton Business and Professional Women's Club, served as Chairman of International Relations, Legislation and Bylaws Committees and as Parliamentarian; member of Canton College Club, served on Constitution Committee; serving 16th year on Board of Trustees of the YWCA of Canton, Ohio, having drafted its Constitution and Bylaws, worked in health and recreation departments, teen-age department, as vocational guidance director, Chairman of Adult Program Department, Program Planning Committee, Finance Committee, serves as Chairman of Personnel Committee and legal advisor; taught class in Contract Bridge to business and professional men and women for many years; elected to office of Second Vice President in February, 1964; has served as Parliamentarian of many organizations; member of Canton Woman's Club; has served on many civic and community drives.
