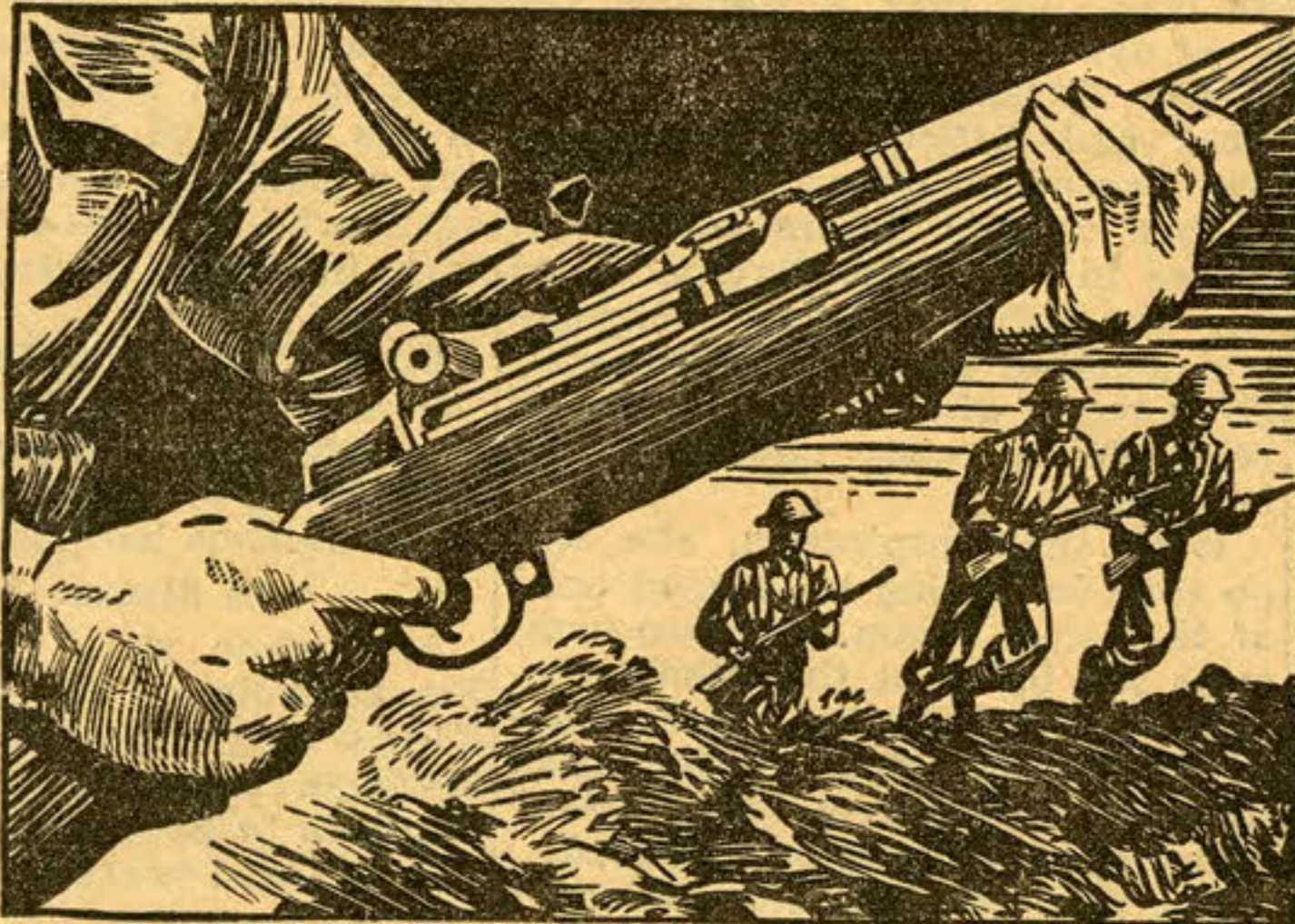

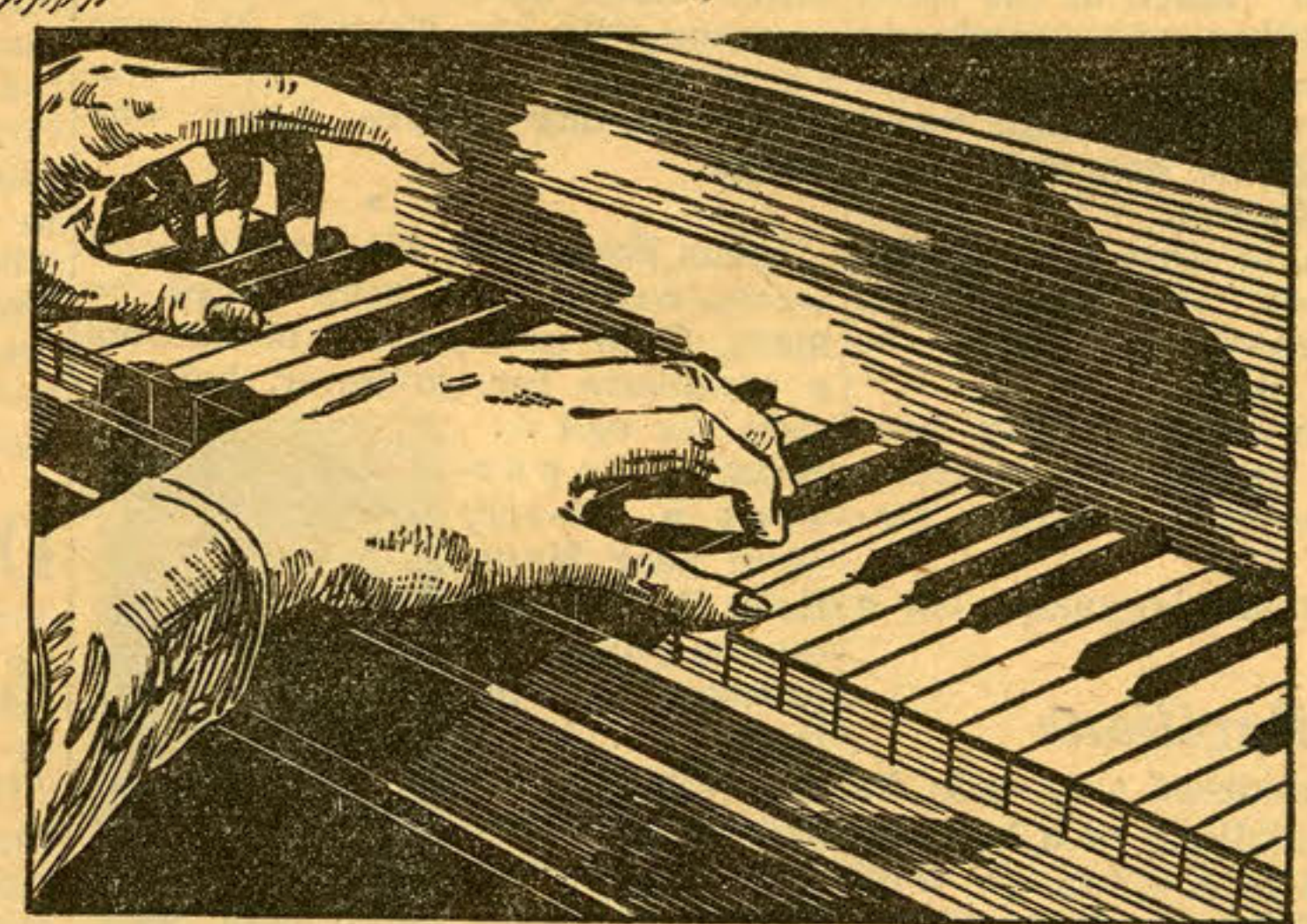
- 1 The Minute Men had it.

 Read the facts—then please act quickly.



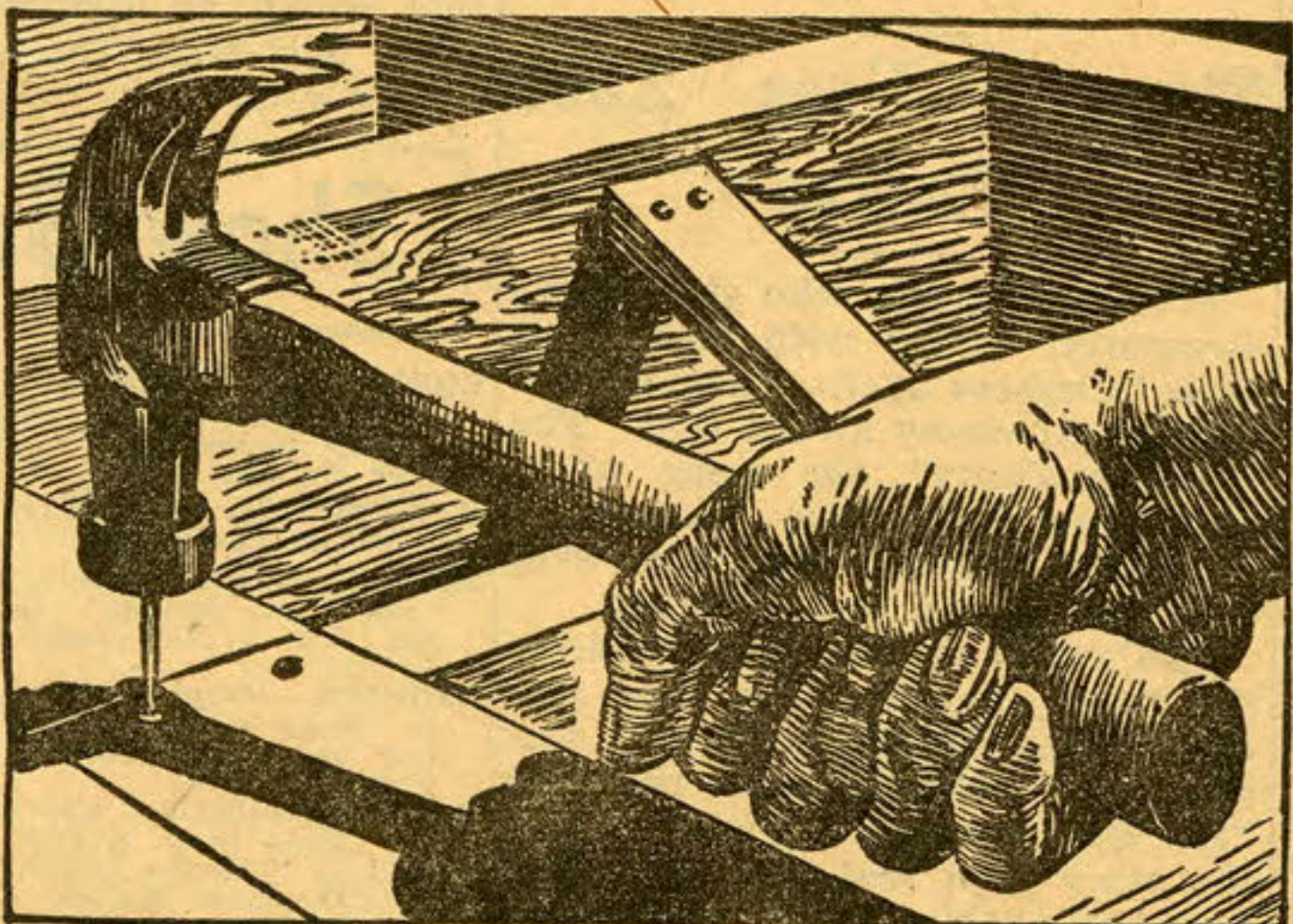
