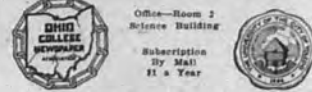

**STAR NEIGHBORS**

Of all the groups of stars in the heavens there is none that has been wrapped in a vast cloud of nebulae so universal and so romantic an interest as the Pleiades. The magic of their quivering, misty light has called upon a great wit, long ago, to name a strong appeal to men of imagination and poets of the early days sang of their beauty and beauty, and many of the great poets from Homer and the author of Job down to Tennyson and men of our own day, have had their own fancy relieved by them, and in one form or another have celebrated their sweetness, mystery and charm. Even today people who do not know their books, but who are captivated by the influence of Pleiades' there is a vague memory of some story about a Pleiad that stirs an emotion suggestively of something romantic and sad.

The Pleiades are a delightful group of twinkling, unobtrusive stars, singularly fascinating and singularly persistent in their brilliancy. Of the six that can usually be seen with the naked eye, all but one are of the fourth magnitude and are very bright. The group must be millions of times as remote from the earth as the stars of the Pleiades are.

The nine brightest stars of the Pleiades bear the names of Atlas and his seven daughters and their mother, the nymph Pleione. Atlas is the star which is at the end of the handle of the dipper and is the fourth magnitude star, and one sometimes fancies what a splendid great star they would seem to us if they would only juggle a little closer together so that we might see them as one.

Even on the surface of the sky just as we see them, they are not so close together as we often regard them. The full moon, which is about halfway between the Pleiades and the star, is about as far from the Pleiades as the stars are from each other.
