ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

ARTICLE I

NAME

This Corporation shall be known as Assistance Dogs for Freedom, Inc. It shall be organized as a corporation, not for profit, under the laws of the State of Ohio. Its principal office shall be located in Columbus, Franklin County, Ohio.

ARTICLE II

PURPOSE

Section 1:

The purpose of the Corporation is to establish, maintain and operate a non-profit, charitable corporation under Chapter 1702 of the Ohio Revised Code for the provision of trained dogs and/or adaptive equipment that aid persons with mobility-impairments and/or multiple physical disabilities.

Section 2:

To establish an assistance dog training program at the Marysville Women's Prison in Marysville, Ohio, or such other correctional facility or facilities as the Board, from time-to-time, deems appropriate to the corporation's exempt purpose. This program will endeavor to rehabilitate the affected inmates and facilitate the placement of assistance dogs with the disabled.

Section 3:

To educate the recipient about the use and care of the dog and/or equipment.

Section 4:

To educate the general public with respect to the services and purposes of the Corporation.

Section 5:

To collect funds to offset the cost of providing these specially trained dogs and/or adaptive equipment.

Section 6:

The corporation shall be organized and operated exclusively for charitable, educational and scientific purposes within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954.

ARTICLE III

POLICY

Section 1:

The Corporation's business shall be carried on without the purpose of gain for its Members/Trustees, and any profits or other accretion to the Corporation shall be used specifically in promoting its objectives.

Section 2:

It is hereby ordained and declared that the Board of Trustees shall serve as such without remuneration, and no Trustee shall directly, or indirectly receive any profit for him/her as such; however, a Trustee may be paid reasonable expenses incurred by him/her in the performance of his/her duties.

Section 3:

The Corporation will not discriminate against race, color, religion, sexual orientation, age, physical disability or national origin of its employees, Trustees, Officers, members and/or recipients.

ARTICLE IV

DISSOLUTION

The Corporation may be dissolved at any time by the written consent of two-thirds (2/3) of the Trustees at a meeting called for that purpose. Notices of said meeting shall be mailed by the Corresponding Secretary at least twenty (20) days in advance. In such case, after payment of all just debts and liabilities, and its dissolution in accordance with the corporate laws of the State of Ohio, its assets and properties shall be distributed for one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of Section 501(c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or shall be distributed to the Federal government, or to a state or local government or for a public purpose.

The following persons shall serve said corporation as trustees until the first annual meeting or other meeting called to elect trustees:



ARTICLE VI


AMENDING


