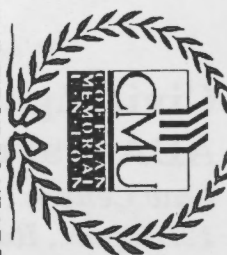

## Hugh G. Gallagher

Hugh Gallagher is an author, scholar and government consultant on the issues and rights concerning people with disabilities. He has worked as a corporate investment strategist advisor, a legislative strategist, and a writer, scholar and consultant for the government regarding regulatory principles and policies. Mr. Gallagher has also served as a campaign coordinator for the presidential campaigns of Lyndon Johnson and Hubert H. Humphrey. He has used a wheelchair since contracting paralytic polio in 1952.

Mr. Gallagher's long list of published works includes *FDR: A Splendid Deception* and *By Trust Betrayed: Patients, Physicians, and the License to Kill in the Third Reich*. Articles of his have been published in the *New York Times* and the *Washington Post*.

Mr. Gallagher's visit to the University will focus on his work regarding disabilities. He was one of the leaders of the Architectural Barriers Act of 1968, which was the first legislation on the subject in the world. He was also an advisor for the the current legislation of the Americans with Disabilities Act.
