Thanks very much for your manuscript for EXCHANGE on " World Perspectives in Intercultural Education." Several of us here have read the manuscript with much interest which of course we should since we solicited it from you. But somehow or the other we think it needs re-working.

I have discussed it with Howard Reed, who is a member of your Board of Trustees. Could you perhaps send the article to Professor Hans Spiegel at the School of Architecture at Columbia University (if the students have not destroyed it) and to David Jenkins at Temple University. Both of these men, I gather from Howard, could have some answers to such questions as how the locale where the group met was picked, how the participants are chosen, how many nationalities are represented, how the field assignments are chosen and so on. I gather that your program has previously operated on a shoestring budget and your methods of financing would be of interest.

I do not mean to discourage you but I'm afraid you are far too general and the program does not at all come alive, as I am sure it could. I do hope to hear from you soon, perhaps by June 30 for the fall issue.
