Dear Mr. Stacy:

I have been very anxious to learn what you did in the Long Lake matter as a new proposition has been brought to my attention. If you have made any progress there, make every effort possible to get some acreage on a good lake in that vicinity.

I have come in touch with a man who has conducted a number of summer camps for boys and he wants lake frontage somewhere in Michigan to conduct a school. We would own the property and erect the buildings. He would supervise the boy's camp and bring in from one hundred to two hundred boys at a yearly rate of \$200.00 per boy. This would, of course, call for a great deal of lake frontage with a bathing beach on the lake or nearby, and not over eight or ten miles from a railroad station so that the parents could visit the children. The parents could be sold lots on the property and in that way additional profits would be made.

I am very much enthused over this proposition and I wish you would make every effort possible to get suitable lake frontage at the right price.
