Dear Mr. Jennings:-

I am writing you again in connection with the coming convention of the Ohio Police Chiefs Association.

You no doubt remember that when I saw you in Toledo about three weeks ago, that you were going to call upon me at Cleveland within a week or ten days from that time for the purpose of giving me definite information on the dates, etc. Mr. Glover also wishes to know whether or not you have spoken to any of the printers at Toledo regarding the printing of our year-book.
