Mrs. Wilbur W. White, widow of a former president of the University of Toledo and the mother of three children, will become Counselor of Women at the University of Southern California September 1, Dr. Bernard L. Hyink, dean of students, announced today.

Mrs. White will come to SC from Houston, Texas, where she has been living since the death of her husband last fall. He was a special lecturer in political science at Rice Institute at the time. His brother-in-law, Dr. William Houston, president of Rice Institute, was on the faculty at the California Institute of Technology, Pasadena, for 20 years before he became head of Rice in 1946.

Mrs. White is a graduate of the University of Chicago with Degrees of Bachelor of Philosophy in English and Philosophy and Master of Arts in English. She also attended the University of St. Andrews in Scotland.

She taught high school in Morenci, Arizona, and was dean of girls there; taught in Shorewood high school, Milwaukee, Wisconsin; the Summit School for Girls, St. Paul, Minn., and the Hathaway-Brown School for Girls, Shaker Heights, Cleveland, Ohio.

She was adviser to graduate women at Western Reserve University, Cleveland, when her late husband was dean of the Graduate School there. Dr. White was on the Western Reserve faculty 12 years.

At the University of Toledo from 1947 to 1950 Mrs. White advised wives of veterans, was a member of the board of the city's Family Life Association, and worked closely with the campus YWCA.

Mrs. White will succeed Helen Hall Moreland, who resigned after ten years as SC's counselor of women.
