FOR RELEASE ON RECEIPT

Four graduate fellowships in science education have been granted The University of Toledo under the National Defense Education Act, President William S. Carlson announced today.

Notification from the U. S. Office of Health, Education and Welfare was received by the Graduate Division and the College of Education under whose auspices the students will do their work.

Each fellowship is valued at \$2000 to \$2400 a year and is renewable for three years to enable a recipient to acquire the doctorate. They are to prepare for college teaching in science education. They are the first of this type to be received by the university, which is one of 173 institutions listed for the first time.

Dr. Robert R. Buell will supervise the work of the fellows, who will begin their work next September. He will supply application forms upon request. Those seeking the fellowships must hold a bachelor's degree and must not have completed more than a half year (eight semester hours) of graduate work applicable toward the degree in this program. However, about 150 out of the national total of 1500 authorized may be assigned to graduate students in their second or third year of graduate work after the baccalaureate degree.

Successful applicants will be notified by March 20 and must accept by April 15.
