The model of a new \$1,000,000 classroom building for which plans are now being completed was unveiled recently at the University of Toledo (Ohio).

Funds for construction of the three-story building will be provided by a trust fund established in 1931 by Mrs. Walter B. Snyder, of Toledo, who died July 19, 1961.

Bellman, Gillett & Richards, of Toledo, architects and engineers for the University, said construction is expected to begin in July of this year with completion and occupancy scheduled for September, 1963.

The building, which will be the first on the campus to be completely air-conditioned, will house the College of Education, offices for the graduate division, summer sessions offices, the computer center and the university book store which will be moved from the Student Union.

The structure, which will have 49,000 square feet of floor space, will include six large lecture rooms, two seating 230 persons each and the others accomodating 140 each, educational laboratories, seminar rooms, 27 faculty offices and classrooms.

President William S. Carlson said the building will be named for the donor and her husband, an investment broker, who died in 1929. Remaining in the trust fund will be about \$250,000 to provide an endowment for upkeep of the building, he said.
