A total of 650 University of Toledo students will receive graduate, undergraduate and associate degrees Thursday, June 6 at 7:30 p.m. at the 1963 Commencement ceremonies in TU's field house.

The total number to receive degrees is considerably less than the record 762 participants last June. However, in past years students who were to complete their degree requirements during the summer were permitted to take part in the June commencement. This year, a special commencement ceremony will be held in late August, following the end of summer classes. More than 100 persons are expected to receive their degrees at that time.

Dr. William S. Carlson, TU president, will deliver the commencement address, and will confer honorary Doctor of Laws degrees on Dr. Lyman Spitzer, Jr., Princeton University astrophysicist, and Thomas S. Gates, president of New York's Morgan Guaranty Trust Company and former Secretary of Defense.

The title of Professor Emeritus will be awarded to three retiring TU faculty members. They are: Dr. Helen Holt, Dr. Andrew Townsend and Dr. Homer Dunathan. Greetings from the Silver Anniversary Class of '38 will be extended by Mrs. Robert Faber, and Mayor John Potter, '40, will administer the service pledge.

Of the degrees to be conferred this year the largest number -- 240 -- will be awarded by the College of Education, including 52 master's and 186 bachelor's degrees. In all, 495 bachelor's degrees, 89 master's degrees and 66 associate degrees will be awarded.
