The University of Toledo will graduate some 730* persons at commencement ceremonies on Thursday, June 4 at 7:30 p.m. in the TU field house. Three Toledo men are candidates for honorary doctor of laws degrees. They are: Harry R. Winkle, vice chairman of the Owens-Corning Fiberglas Corp.; Otto Wittmann, director of the Toledo Museum of Arts; and, W. Paul Zimmerman, civic leader and former executive vice president of Owens-Corning Fiberglas Corp.

TU also will award its second and third earned doctorates. Scheduled to receive the doctor of education degrees are John W. Mould, 1953 Calumet, and Richard R. Perry, 3361 Romaker Rd., Sylvania. TU awarded its first EdD degree in 1962 to Mrs. Shirley Myers Plessner, who now is teaching at Heidelberg College.

The 23 graduates in TU's College of Law are to receive the bachelor of laws degree. However, TU's Board of Directors has approved a new degree -- the Juris Doctor -- for law college graduates. The Ohio Board of Regents must give final approval to the degree before it may be awarded and Dr. William S. Carlson, TU president, has asked the regents to permit the awarding of that degree to this year's law graduates.

The College of Education leads in the number of graduates, with 39 persons scheduled to receive master of education degrees and 192 persons to receive the bachelor of education degree.

A total of 14 students are to receive their degrees magna cum laude (with high honors) and 34 others will be awarded degrees cum laude (with honors). The highest ranking graduate in this year's class is Robert Krauss, 2145 Alvin St. He has compiled a 3.777 grade average (4 points equal A).

President Carlson will deliver the commencement address.
