The University of Toledo's 6th annual Arts Festival Week will open on Monday (May 3) at noon with ceremonies scheduled in TU's Student Union. Dr. William S. Carlson, TU president; Dr. Boris E. Nelson, professor of humanities; and Kathleen Modrowski, student chairman of arts festival week, will speak.

Features of the week long program include a Tuesday noon "One-Woman Show" by Marta Becket, dance mime; a University Convocation on Thursday at noon, with John Ciardi, poet, author and editor, speaking on "Why Read?"; and a performance by Nina Simone and her Trio on Saturday at 8 p.m. in the Peristyle of the Toledo Museum of Art.

The week's programs include: Monday, 12:45 p.m., opening of an Art Exhibit in the Student Union; and 7:30 p.m., "A Night of Poetry and Jazz," with J. Radcliffe Squires, professor of literature at the University of Michigan, and Jim Cook and Combo.

On Tuesday: Noon, Marta Becket; Art Exhibit, all day, Student Union lounge; and, at 7:30 p.m., "Student Showcase," featuring student performers from other countries in the Student Union.

On Wednesday at noon, there will be an Arts Fair from noon to 3 p.m. on TU's front campus, with a display and sale of works by student artists; and, at 7:30 p.m., a program of "Experimental Film-Makers" featuring Gregory Markopoulos, Storm deHirsch and Stan Brakhage.

Thursday's program includes the noon program featuring Mr. Ciardi,

to be followed by an informal discussion with Mr. Ciardi scheduled for 3 p.m. in the Student Union lounge. At 7:30 p.m. on Thursday, films featuring Charlie Chaplin, W.C. Fields and Peter Sellers will be shown in the Student Union.

On Friday at noon a discussion of "The Meaning of Contemporary Art" will be held in the Student Union. Participants and their topics are: Dr. Wallace Martin and William Leckie, Jr., literature; Dr. Bernard Coyne and Betty Ann Pizzo, theater; Dr. J. Robert Carroll and Steven Worshtil, music; and James K. Barbee and Linda Ames, plastic arts. Dr. Ernest W. Gray will act as moderator. Friday at 8 p.m., the Kerwin Theatre Ballet Co., featuring Ron Steinbeck, will present "An Evening of Ballet" in the Student Union south lounge.

On Saturday at 7:30 p.m., two theater-in-the-round productions will be presented in the Student Union. "Hope is the Thing with Feathers" will be directed by Betty Ann Pizzo, and John A. McCleary II will direct a production of "The Tiger."

The Arts Festival Week program will end Saturday following the appearance of Nina Simone in the peristyle. Arts Festival Week is sponsored by TU's Student Union Board.
