Dr. Judis appointed pharmacy dean

Dr. Joseph Judis, a 1949 graduate of The University of Toledo College of Pharmacy, was named dean of that college today by TU's Board of Directors. Dr. Judis, professor of pharmacy and chairman of the department of biology for the past year, will assume his new duties at the beginning of the second semester. He replaces Dr. Charles H. Larwood, dean of the college since 1946 and senior dean in length of service at TU.

Dr. William S. Carlson, TU president, said dean Larwood has requested a leave during the second semester after which he will retire. President Carlson commended Dean Larwood for his administration of the pharmacy college during the period of rebuilding after World War II and in the transition from the four-year to the five-year curriculum in the college.

Dean Larwood joined the TU faculty in 1946 after four years in medical work with the U.S. Army during World War II. Prior to that he had held professorships at Ferris Institute and the University of Grand Rapids. He is a graduate of the University of Oklahoma and holds the M.S. degree from Oklahoma A&M College and the Ph.D. degree from Michigan State University. He served in the U.S. Navy during World War I.

A native Toledoan, Dr. Judis attended Scott High School and received the bachelor of science in pharmacy degree from TU. He received the master of science and doctor of philosophy degrees in biological science from Purdue University and did postdoctoral research for two years at the Western Reserve Medical School. Dr. Judis joined the TU faculty in 1956 as an assistant professor and was named associate professor in 1958 and professor in 1962. Last year, he was named chairman of TU's biology department.

Dr. Judis lives at 3006 Algonquin Pkwy. with his wife and two children.
