Commencement ceremonies for The University of Toledo's 83rd academic year will be held on Thursday (June 9) at 7:30 p.m. in the TU Field House.

Dr. William S. Carlson, TU president, will deliver the commencement address.

TU's 25th anniversary class of 1941 will be represented at commencement by Theodore Markwood, 4231 Beverly Dr., Toledo attorney and a member of the class of 1941.

Named to receive honorary doctor of laws degrees (LL.D.) are: John Marshall Briley, chairman of the Ohio Board of Regents, and vice president and general counsel for Owens-Corning Fiberglas Corp.; Dr. John D. Millett, chancellor of the Ohio Board of Regents and former president of Miami (Ohio) University; and Dr. Harold W. Oyster, vice president for development for The University of Akron and former chairman of the Ohio Board of Regents.

Approximately 643 persons are candidates for degrees, ranging from the two-year associate degree to the doctor's degree. Candidates for the doctor of education degree are Byron F. Radebaugh and Doris A. Siegel and Charles W. Ryan is a candidate for the doctor of philosophy degree. TU will also award the doctor of jurisprudence degree to 35 graduates of the College of Law.

Candidate for the sixth year certificate in counseling and guidance is Nancy S. Wygant. James H. Hoit is a candidate for the sixth year certificate in educational administration.

There are 114 master's degree candidates; 408 bachelor's degree candidates; 2 associate degree candidates in the College of Business Administration; and 79 associate degree candidates in the Community and Technical College.

A total of 46 students will graduate with honors: 15, magna cum laude; 21, cum laude; and 10, high scholarship.

During the commencement program, commissions as second lieutenants in the U. S. Army Reserve will be awarded to 12 University of Toledo Reserve Officers Training Corps cadets. Col. Charles A. Christin, Jr., professor of military science at TU, will administer the oath of office to the graduating seniors, and President Carlson will present the commissions.
