Ground-breaking ceremonies for The University of Toledo's Community and Technical College new campus at Scott Park will be held on Wednesday, Oct. 26 at 10 a. m. Gov. James A. Rhodes will turn the first spadeful of earth at the new campus, where a total of \$7.2 million worth of construction is to begin late this year.

Originally, six buildings are planned for the Scott Park campus. They include: an academic services building, classroom building, learning resources center and a basic science laboratory building, which will form a four-building complex in the center of the campus; an engineering technology center; and a non-academic services building.

The original buildings will provide some 229,400 square feet of floor space and are designed to accommodate a student body of 5,000 persons.

Construction will be financed by \$6 million of state bond issue funds, \$1 million in Federal matching funds, and \$200,000 in local funds, according to Dr. William S. Carlson, TU president.

The extension of Parkside Boulevard, which currently runs through the park in the area planned for the center of the educational building complex, will be relocated and straightened as part of the project. The site will be landscaped and improvements will be made to the pond near the north edge of the proposed building complex.

The site plan was prepared by Johnson, Johnson and Roy (Ann Arbor, Mich.) The Toledo firm of Samborn, Steketee, Otis and Evans is architect for the project.
