The University of Toledo's Board of Trustees today (December 12) selected the Toledo architectural firms of Britsch, Macelwane, Poseler and Lubeck, and Munger, Munger and Associates to begin preliminary architectural planning for construction of a new library and new facilities for the College of Law.

Britsch, Macelwane, Poseler and Lubeck will develop preliminary plans for the College of Law project; Munger, Munger and Associates will handle the library planning.

The Board also appropriated \$50,000 to finance plans for the College of Law facility and \$72,700 for the library project, and authorized the University's president, Dr. William S. Carlson, and vice president-treasurer, Willard Smith, to undertake necessary steps for planning the two projects, including submission of requests to the Ohio Board of Regents and the Controlling Board for permission to proceed.

The University's master plan calls for the location of the College of Law facility on property along Secor Road, and the location of the new library on a site southwest of the existing Student Union Building.

In other action, the Board established a department of higher education within the University's College of Education and created an interdisciplinary center for the study of higher education. Dr. Richard H. Davis, assistant dean of the College of Education and associate professor of education, was named acting chairman of the new department. (See accompanying release)

The Board moved to study a proposal to require foreign students enrolled at the University to maintain health insurance coverage, approved the appointments of James K. Weekly as associate professor of business economics and Tessie Mae Seamon as counseling psychologist and instructor in education, and accepted gifts to the University from various sources totaling more than \$34,000.

They also appointed members of the University's Athletic Board of Control, including Dr. Richard Boyer, associate professor of history, to succeed the late Dr. Ralph C. Kendall, former dean of adult and continuing education, and alumni representative Donald P. O'Brien, replacing Frank T. Pizza. The Board consists of five faculty representatives, two alumni members, and the University's executive vice president, Dr. Jesse Long, and president of the student body Myron Hatcher, as ex-officio members.

A resolution extending sympathy to the wife and son of the late Professor Charles J. Kirschner, Sr., long-time director of the University's Summer Sessions, and a member of the faculty of the College of Business Administration as associate professor of transportation, was passed by the board and made a part of its permanent records.
