The University of Toledo Board of Trustees today(Friday) adjusted its student fees to conform to the new quarter system calendar which the University will adopt in the Fall of 1968. The University currently uses a semester system.

Instructional and student services fees remain the same. Instructional fees for the average undergraduate enrolled for 15 semester hours now total \$450 annually, and will be the same under the quarter system. The student services fee, currently \$96 for two semesters, will remain at \$96 for three quarters.

The tuition surcharge for out-of-state students was increased from an average of \$540 annually to \$585 annually. This is a surcharge which applies only to students from outside the state and is in line with the recommendation of the Ohio Board of Regents that the out-of-state surcharge should be about \$600 annually.

Willard W. Smith, vice president-treasurer, noted that by maintaining the student services fee at the same level there would be limited student services funds to meet the expanded requests for 1967-68.

The trustees also approved changes in the University's refund policies to conform with the new quarter system calendar, and eliminated the deferred payment plan for student fees which had been permitted under the semester calendar. Students now will be required to pay all fees in full at the time of registration.

In other action, the Trustees authorized President William S. Carlson to continue the existing policy of paying up to \$1,000 for moving expenses for new faculty members and administrative officers. The Trustees also appointed Professor Harold G. Oddy to represent the University in matters related to the tax-free purchase of alcohol for laboratory and classroom use.
