Appointment of a director to head the newly created department of campus security at The University of Toledo was announced today (July 18) by Willard W. Smith, vice president-treasurer.

Named director of campus security is Captain Charles E. Lovejoy whose appointment at the University is effective September 1, after his retirement in August from Ohio's State Highway Patrol.

Captain Lovejoy will be responsible for all aspects of the protection of persons and of University property, including supervision of the University police, motor vehicle registration, control of traffic and parking, fire protection and related functions. He also will maintain contacts with other local, state and federal police agencies. Captain Lovejoy will report to Mr. Smith.

An officer of the State Highway Patrol since 1941, Captain Lovejoy is now operations officer at patrol headquarters in Columbus, where he has been assigned since 1965.

From 1962 until 1965, he was commanding officer of District I in Findlay with responsibility for the 12 counties in northwestern Ohio, and in 1952 was commanding officer of what was then the Perrysburg Post.

During World War II, Captain Lovejoy served in the U.S. Army and was discharged with the rank of captain. He was born in Archbold, Ohio, is a graduate of Swanton High School and plans to live in Maumee, Ohio. He is married and the father of three daughters.

Commenting on the new appointment, Dr. William S. Carlson, TU president, said, "We believe that the broad professional police experience of this man makes him an excellent choice for this new position."

Mr. Smith explained that the University police have previously been one of the functions of the physical plant department, but adds that it has now become necessary to create a new department in order to free the department of physical plant to devote its attention to the development and operation of the University's West Bancroft Street and Scott Park campuses.

A General Information Bulletin, the first publication of its type to be issued by The University of Toledo, has been published for the 1968-69 academic year.

The bulletin is intended primarily for prospective students, their parents, and high school counselors, but also will serve as a source of general information for others interested in the University.

The 64-page publication has an introductory message from President William S. Carlson and includes a large-scale map of the 206-acre main campus.

A "University Profile" section describes the University's history, organizational structure, facilities, and services. Separate sections are devoted to admissions and academic policies and to the programs of each of the undergraduate colleges. The Honors Program and the ROTC curriculum also are detailed.

The 8½-by-11-inch bulletin also includes a number of photographs of student activities, campus facilities, and classroom and laboratory scenes. Many are in color.

The inside back cover forms a pocket for insertion of bulletins of the various colleges or brochures providing detailed information in specific areas such as financial aid, housing, and fees.
