The approval of a request to the Ohio Board of Regents for \$26,099,000 in operating and supplemental funds for The University of Toledo during the 1969-1971 biennium and the awarding of a food service contract for operation of dormitory cafeterias and other campus food service facilities to ARA-Slater School and College Services, a division of ARA Services of Philadelphia, Pa., were among the actions of the University's Board of Trustees which met this morning (August 27.)

The Board also created a division of campus security, designated its director, and held a brief discussion of the status of proposed renovation of the University's Glass Bowl.

The University's request for operating funds from the Ohio Board of Regents, which will be incorporated with other state university appropriation requests and submitted to the Ohio legislature, compares with TU's appropriation for the current biennium (1967-1969) of \$13,887,000. It is based on the University's expectation of an enrollment of 12,000 full-time equivalent students in 1969, and 13,000 in 1970. Predicted enrollment for the Fall quarter, 1968, is 10,634.

Six food service companies submitted bids for the operation of the University's food service facilities during the coming year. The bids were reviewed by a committee consisting of Williard Smith, vice-president, finance; Kenneth Sabella, food service consultant retained by the University earlier this year and, Dr. Harold Hakes, newly-named associate dean of students. The committee recommended to the Board that it contract for such services with ARA-Slater, and that vending operations continue to be operated by the Canteen Service Company of Toledo.

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The Board also authorized a board rate for dorm students living on campus of \$148 per quarter or \$444 per three-quarter year, representing an increase of \$8 per quarter or \$24 per year over the rate currently charged. The increase covers, in part, the University's obligation to maintain food service equipment and facilities and of other services not covered by the food service contract.

The Board designated Charles E. Lovejoy, currently a captain with the Ohio State Highway Patrol headquarters in Columbus, as director of campus security, after instituting the new campus police organizational unit.

Stephen Stranahan, board member and chairman of the finance committee, reported on discussions his committee has held regarding the proposed renovation of the University's Glass Bowl. He called for an agreement by the Board on the proper priority of the project, and suggested that an orderly procedure be mapped to study the financial feasibility of the project. Faculty and student opinion should be sought, he noted, and plans made for hiring a financial consultant to help determine exact building costs and sources of revenue. Board member Richard C. Heymann, Jr., chairman of the buildings and ground committee which has been consulting with the finance committee, and Dr. William Carlson president of the University, supported Mr. Stranahan's suggestions.

In other business, the Board approved an agreement to provide certain courses for the Flower Hospital School of Nursing, and adopted a resolution of condolence on the death of Dr. Nelson Hovey, professor of chemistry and former chairman of the University department of chemistry, last month.
