Dr. William S. Carlson, president of The University of Toledo, will be inducted as an honorary member of Gamma Epsilon chapter of Beta Alpha Psi, national professional accounting fraternity, at the organization's initiation ceremony and banquet Friday (Nov. 12) at 7:30 p.m. at the Commodore Perry Motor Inn.
