A meeting of representatives of Northwestern Ohio schools which offer two-year, associate degree programs will be held at The University of Toledo's Scott Park campus on Tuesday, January 11. Hosting the meeting will be Dr. Newton C. Rochte, dean of the UT Community and Technical College.

Attending will be Max F. Covert, President of Four County Technical Institute, Archbold, O.; Roy W. Klay, president of Vanguard Technical Institute, Fremont, O.; Sister Mary Agnes, dean of Lourdes Junior College, Sylvania, O.; Dr. James H. McBride, director of the Firelands campus of Bowling Green State University, Huron, O.; and, Dr. Jacob H. See, president of Michael J. Owens State Technical College, Perrysburg, O. Dr. Max Lerner, vice chancellor for two-year programs for the Ohio Board of Regents, also has been invited to attend.

Dean Rochte commented that it is hoped that the meetings will result in a mutual sharing of information on problems and their solutions and that they will help to increase the public's awareness of two-year programs. A second meeting of the same personnel will be held later this year on the campus of Michael J. Owens State Technical College.

The group will meet in Dean Rochte's office in the Scott Park Academic Services Center, room 205, at 10:30 a.m. and then will tour the facilities of the Community and Technical College. After the tour the group will come to the Student Union on the main campus for a luncheon in the Ingman Room. Also attending the luncheon will be Dr. William S. Carlson, UT president, and Dr. William H. Leckie, vice president for academic affairs at UT.

The meeting will conclude with an information sharing session scheduled for the Scott Park campus Academic Services Center, room 205C, immediately after the luncheon. The meeting is expected to adjourn by 2:30 p.m.

C. Donald Curry, registrar of the Bureau of Motor Vehicles, State of Ohio, will be at The University of Toledo at 3 p.m. Tuesday, Feb. 8, to present license plate 1-UT to Dr. William S. Carlson, the University's president.

Mr. Curry will make the presentation in the president's office in University Hall.

Ohio's 1972 license plates are blue and gold, honoring The University of Toledo's centennial year.

Reservations also are being taken at two locations on the University campus and at the Kilbride Auto License Agency, 1609 Canton St., for a limited number of available license plates which bear the UT initials. The University locations are in the Student Union and at the Alumni Office in Tucker Hall.

The University locations for the UT plates are open daily, except Saturdays and Sundays, from 8:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. until the limited supply is exhausted. Auto owners are reminded to bring certificates of title and registration cards when filing their reservations. The charge for the UT plates is \$12.

The UT plates will be available for pick up at the Alumni Office beginning March 15. The 1972 plates must be displayed on Ohio autos by April 16.
