The University of Toledo's phase II addition to the Student Union Building will be dedicated on Wednesday, November 15, at noon with ceremonies in the new auditorium. Dedication speaker will be Dr. Charles G. Hurst, Jr., president of Malcolm X College (Chicago, Ill.).

The three-story, 93,600-square-foot addition, built at a cost of \$3,650,000, includes the auditorium, interior and exterior commons areas, two dining rooms and a new kitchen. Construction on the addition began in October, 1970 and it was nearly complete and in use by the beginning of the current (1972) fall quarter.

Presiding at the dedication ceremonies will be Ronald McCracken, president of UT's Student Body Government. Dr. Glen R. Driscoll, UT president, will speak briefly. Others scheduled to participate in the ceremonies include Dr. Lancelot C.A. Thompson, vice president for student affairs; John F. Savage, member of the UT Board of Trustees; Thomas Connelly, executive vice president of A. Bentley and Sons Co., general contractor for the project; Dallas L. Garber, director of the Student Union; and, Rev. Robert Kirtland, Catholic chaplain at UT. Mr. Connelly will present the keys to the building to Mr. Garber.

Also scheduled are a luncheon for UT students immediately following the dedication ceremonies and a concert by the Steve Worshtil Trio. The event, to be held in the auditorium, will offer students a 50-cent lunch as well as a concert by the three-member jazz ensemble.

Architects for the Student Union addition were Richards, Bauer and Moorhead of Toledo.

The Board of Trustees of The University of Toledo today approved organization of a Centennial fund campaign. Trustee John Savage, chairman of the steering committee, said the decision is the result of an extensive survey made early this fall under the direction of Ketchum, Inc., fund-raising counsel.

He said the feasibility study, which followed conferences with a number of community leaders, indicates that the University could succeed in such a drive and that plans for it should be started at once. Cost of the study was underwritten by the Alumni Association.

The steering committee also includes Dr. Edward Nussel, chairman of the Faculty Senate and professor of education; Ronald McCracken, president of Student Body Government; Stephen Stranahan, chairman of the Trustees; President Glen R. Driscoll; Edward C. Schmakel, director of alumni relations; and, Dr. Harold W. Oyster, general chairman of the Centennial committee and vice president for University development.

The committee will seek input from faculty, students, alumni and others on timing of the campaign, the list of objectives and the priority of each, and the amounts needed for them. Also to be determined is the makeup of the general campaign committee and its organizational structure.

Chairman Stranahan said the Board would expect a committee report by March 15 so that the campaign organization, objectives and financial goal could be announced at that time.
