The University of Toledo's Board of Trustees has approved the appointment of Beverly L. Mullins as affirmative action compliance officer.

Her appointment, effective Aug. 30, has ended a 10-week search in which there were over 70 applicants, according to Christopher Helm, manager of personnel services and chairman of the search committee.

"We ran a carefully designed search to find the most qualified person for that job and in our best judgment Mrs. Mullins is the best," University President Glen R. Driscoll said. "We are all very impressed that she is extremely articulate, energetic, and experienced in affirmative action compliance."

Mrs. Mullins, a graduate of Bowling Green State University, received the bachelor of science degree in business administration in 1976 and a master of business administration degree from BGSU in 1977 before joining that university's staff in 1977 as assistant director of the equal opportunity compliance office. In 1979, Mrs. Mullins was named director of that office where she served until joining UT in August.

"My job at UT," Mrs. Mullins said, "is to create positive action to insure equal opportunity for employment and education for all."

Mrs. Mullins resides in Toledo with her husband, Ray, who received a law degree from the UT College of Law last June. He is associated with the Toledo law firm of Cooper, Straub, Walinski & Cramer.
