

# 6 Names Added To Honor Roll

## Heroes Were Killed During Battle Action

Omitted from the list of World War II dead Thursday were the names of five Lucas County servicemen relatives informed The Blade today. The War Department has announced that a list bearing names omitted from the original Honor Roll will be prepared.

Names omitted from the list were:

Pfc. William Warner Brown, son of Mrs. Lawrence Brown, Maumee, O. Pfc. Wm. Brown was killed in action in Holland Nov. 22, 1944. He was with the 84th Division.

### European Casualties

Pvt. Leroy C. Harste, son of Mr. and Mrs. William Harste, 1620 Chestnut St., was killed in action in Northern France, Aug. 28, 1944.

Pfc. William D. Kidney, son of Mr. and Mrs. William O. Kidney, 1776 Ottawa Dr., and husband of Valerie Kidney, same address, was killed in action in the Battle of the Bulge, Jan. 2, 1945. He served with the 11th Armoured Division.

Pvt. Louis Starr, son of Mr. and Mrs. Jay Starr, 235 Shepler St., was killed in action Jan. 3, 1945, in the Battle of the Bulge.

### Missing Over Jungles

~~Sergt. Norman Robert~~ Smith, son of Mr. and Mrs. Ray E. Smith, 1827 Evansdale Ave., was declared missing in action Dec. 15, 1944 while on a flight over the Brazilian jungles. He was declared dead in December, 1945. Sergeant Smith was attached to the Air Transport Command, Ferrying Division.

Also omitted in the Wood County list was the name of Pvt. Denver S. Hagemyer, Luckey, O. Private Hagemyer was killed in action Nov. 28, 1945 at Leyte.
