

TU Medical School Plan Adviser Picked

Chicagoan To Serve
As Consultant To
Mayor's Committee

A preliminary consultant was authorized yesterday as a 12-man committee organized to study the feasibility of establishing a medical school at the University of Toledo.

Dr. Ward Darley, Chicago, executive secretary of the Association of American Medical Colleges, agreed to meet with the group sometime next month to discuss procedures that might be followed in the investigation.

Committee members mentioned the need for doctors, availability of clinical material, supply of qualified students, faculty recruitment, management, facilities and financing as being among areas needing exploration.

Also mentioned was TU's place in the state-wide medical education picture now being examined by the governor's Interim Commission on Higher Education.

Mr. Frank F. A. Rawling was elected chairman of the study committee, Dr. Maurice Schnitker, vice chairman, and Dr. Gregor Sido, secretary.

The group was named by Mayor Damas at the request of the TU directors. Other members are Dr. William S. Carlson, TU president; Drs. Edward L. Burns, Saul Kelson, and Byron G. Shaffer; Msgr. Robert Maher, Wilson L. Benfer, John D. Willey, Ward Canaday and J. Slater Gibson.
