

# Medical School Not Abandoned

## Committee Votes Further Efforts

The citizens' committee, studying the feasibility of a medical school for Toledo decided yesterday, after receiving a consultant's report, to continue its functions.

The 12-member group agreed to study the report, follow the report's suggestions in making a decision on the school's feasibility and seek additional funds for carrying forward the study.

The consultant, Dr. William Willard, expressed guarded optimism about the feasibility of a medical school here. He said Toledo is not now ready for such an institution, but added it could prepare in the 10 years or so it would take to establish a medical school.

He suggested that the study committee continue its work as long as necessary, and that it be broadened to represent the entire Toledo region. It should be financed for such continuing studies as are required and should have the services of a professional staff, he added.

He further proposed that the committee obtain staff and consulting services through the University of Toledo, if the school is willing.
