Bill Effective After Senate, Governor Act

7 Other Measures Advance As Session Ends First Week

COLUMBUS, Nov. 11 (AP)—The Ohio House passed, 112-0, and sent to the Senate today a bill creating Toledo State College of Medicine.

The emergency bill by Rep. Raymond E. Hildebrand (R., Lucas) contained a clause to make it effective upon signature of the governor.

Rep. Harold Oyster (R., Washington), chairman of the board of regents, said \$7.5 million has been designated for the new medical college in the proposed \$275 million bond issue announced by Governor Rhodes. Mr. Oyster said that sum would be enough for basic medical school facilities. He added that community support was anticipated.

Bond Plan Advances

Mr. Oyster also said a study indicated that Toledo is a logical site for a 500-bed hospital within the next few years in conjunction with the medical college.

Administration proposals for a multimillion dollar bond issue and an industrial loan program also came into the Senate today along with seven other bills passed by the House before the legislative special session ended its first week of work.

Both houses adjourned until Monday, leaving the touchy issue of congressional redistricting to simmer in the House Elections and Federal Relations Committee. Chairman Charles F. Kurfess (R., Wood), ditched earlier plans to conduct hearings over the weekend.
