Dedication Rites Set For Medical College

Rhodes To Officiate In Ceremony
At School's Temporary Location

Governor Rhodes will dedicate the new Medical College of Ohio in a ceremony on the college's temporary campus Sunday afternoon.

The public is invited to attend the 2:30 p.m. program, to be held in a large tent to be erected on the grounds of William Roche Memorial Hospital, 945 South Detroit Ave.

Two wings of the hospital and a new laboratory building erected next to it are serving as the college's headquarters pending completion of its own permanent campus off Arlington Avenue, between South Detroit Avenue and Byrne Road.

School, Not Facilities

Dr. Glidden Brooks, president of the college, which began classes Monday, said that the governor will be dedicating the school itself, not the facilities, since they are only temporary.

Speakers in addition to Mr. Rhodes and Dr. Brooks will include Paul Block, Jr., chairman of the college board of trustees; John A. Skipton, board vice chairman, and Dr. Robert Page, college dean. Mr. Skipton will introduce the governor.

Roles For Clergy

The Rev. Don S. Hunter, director of hospitals for the Toledo Catholic Diocese, will deliver the invocation, and Dr. Robert E. Hansen, pastor of Christ Presbyterian Church, the benediction.

The college's first 32-member class will be introduced as a group, along with members of the faculty. City, county, and

state officials are among honored guests who also will be introduced
