## \$3 Million Approved *Columbus Citizen* 9-20-69 For Medical School

The board of regents approved \$3 million in state funds for the support of students in the Case Western Reserve University medical college in Cleveland Friday.

The money authorized by the recent Legislature will allow the state to support medical students at the university on the same basis as it supports medical students at Ohio State, the University of Cincinnati, and the Ohio Medical College in Toledo.

THE STATE pays \$4950 per student in calculating aid to medical colleges.

The assistance to the Cleveland institution enables the state to actively support a medical college in the state's largest city without

having to build another school.

THE CWRU medical school is the only private institution in Ohio receiving direct state student assistance.

Approval of the contract under which the Regents will supply the money to Case Reserve highlighted the regular meeting of the Regents whose session was devoted largely to setting up programs authorized by the recent Legislature.

CHANCELLOR John D. Millett discussed with the seven-member board his ideas for a new master plan for higher education.

The Chancellor would have 30 to 35 committees composed of representatives of the various universities submit recommendations for various sections of a new master plan. These would deal with enrollment, inter-university relations and the general field of higher education.
