### THE NEW MEDICAL COLLEGE

It was an emotionally exhilarating day, October 21, 1969 when the Medical College of Ohio at Toledo was dedicated. The first class of thirty-three had already begun classes. They sat together in a special section under the huge tent with their wives or husbands and children. Before them on the platform were school officials, the board of trustees and Governor Rhodes. Around them the faculty, members of Ohio's political hierarchy, Toledo and Lucas County officialdom, and surprisingly, several hundreds of enthusiastic citizens.

Scattered among them all were members of the Academy of Medicine of Toledo and Lucas County. Where—in the faculty, board of trustees, the foundation, a father of a student, and of course, in the crowd at large. Dr. Paul Hohly was there; a teacher in the old Toledo Medical School, happy to be present at the formal opening of the dreamed of successor college. Yes, without the Academy the birth pains of the M.C.O.T. would have been much more arduous. For years before conception thorough planning by the "Damas Committee" successfully brought the school to Toledo instead of cities less prepared. Indeed, essential financing in those early days came largely from an Academy grant from E.P.I.C. funds, an effort of all Academy members.
