

Minutes
Medical College Study Committee
February 28, 1961

The Medical College Study Committee met at 4:30 p. m. February 28 in the office of President Carlson at The University of Toledo. Those in attendance were: Doctors Carlson, Rawling, Shaffer, Sido, Schnitker and Kelson, Messrs Willey, Benfer, Canaday and Damas. Absent were Mr. Gibson, Monsignor Maher and Dr. Burns.

Dr. Rawling called the meeting to order and minutes of the previous meeting were accepted.

Dr. Rawling announced that the City Council budget committee had appropriated \$6500 on February 21 as expense money for this committee with which to hire a consultant. The names of various persons who might serve as a consultant were reviewed and it was decided that a subcommittee composed of Dr. Rawling, Dr. Schnitker and Mr. Benfer would go to Chicago on March 8 to the American Medical Association headquarters to meet with Dr. Ward Darley, secretary of the American Medical Association of Medical Colleges, an AMA affiliate, and Dr. W. S. Wiggins, Council on Medical Education and Hospitals for the AMA.

Dr. Schnitker moved the approval of the expenses of this subcommittee for the trip to Chicago, which was seconded by Dr. Carlson and duly accepted.

Dr. Carlson moved that the subcommittee be given authority to take decisive action in hiring a consultant as deemed fit in accordance with the budget. This resolution was seconded and passed.

Dr. Kelson inquired about the availability of Dr. Doan as consultant.

Mr. Canaday suggested early application to the United States government for aid under the Kennedy program of aid to education.

Also discussed was development of a medical school in two phases; the first phase a two-year school, and the second phase completion of a school at the four-year level.

The meeting was adjourned, further meetings to be called in accordance with developments in Chicago.
