There are entirely too many blind beggars on the streets of the city, singing and playing hand organs. They become obnoxious and the taxpayers are making very serious complaints. The Blind Society will work with us in eliminating this nuisance.

I also want to call your attention to the number of other beggars, not blind, in this city. Yesterday, Sunday morning, a traffic officer was on duty at the Cathedral, and just half a block from him a beggar was sitting in front of the Davis Dry Cleaning Company begging of people as they passed by.

I want you to see that the sergeants give this their special attention and hold the patrolmen accountable for their districts. If they cannot clean up their own districts, I want charges preferred against them.
