Nine members of The University of Toledo faculty will deliver presentations describing the University's research and technical capabilities in the areas of chemistry, biology, pharmacy, and industrial, civil and electrical engineering, at the second annual University Technology for Industry Forum to be held at the Pick Congress Hotel in Chicago from Monday, February 4, through Thursday, February 7.

During the meeting, the University will maintain its own headquarters at the Pick-Congress where followup discussions between industry and University representatives may be conducted and where copies of a specially-prepared brochure -- "Industrial Research in Science and Technology at The University of Toledo" -- will be made available.

Advance planning for the University's participation in the forum has been coordinated over the past several months by a committee of faculty members appointed by Dr. Glen R. Driscoll, UT president. Dr. James B. Farison, dean of the College of Engineering, has served as chairman of that committee.

Representatives of the University scheduled to make presentations at the forum include Dr. Claibourne E. Griffin, professor and chairman of the University's department of chemistry, on "Chemical Developments"; Dr. Donald I. Angelbeck, assistant professor of civil engineering, and Dr. Woon Heng Jyung, associate professor of biology, on "Ecology and Waste Products"; Dr. Thaddeus M. Glen,

professor of industrial engineering, on "Mechanical Developments and Devices"; Dr. William D. Roll, professor of pharmaceutical chemistry, Dr. Harold H. Lee, associate professor of biology, and Dr. Stephen Goldman, assistant professor of biology, on "Developments in Pharmacy and Biology"; and, Dr. O. William Muckenhirn, professor of electrical engineering, and Dr. Donald R. Zrudsky, associate professor of electrical engineering, on "Electrical Materials and Devices."

The University Technology for Industry Forum is sponsored by Dr. Dvorkovitz and Associates of Ormond Beach, Florida, a firm which facilitates the exchange of technical information between universities and industries which may be interested in benefiting from academic research.

Representatives of some 44 universities are expected to participate in the forum.

Dr. Albert Sabin, virologist, former president of Israel's Weizmann Institute and the developer of the oral polio vaccine, is scheduled to discuss "Requirements for Successful Collaboration Between Academic Institutions and Industry" at the forum banquet on Wednesday evening (February 6).
