TU Engineering Dean Otto M. Zmeskal is a member of the Board of Consultants. The meeting, which begins at 10 a.m. in the Ide Room of the Engineering-Science Bldg., will explore the problem of the education of the engineer and the changing needs of industry.

President William S. Carlson, will welcome participants. A panel discussion will consider methods by which universities and industry can cooperate and exchange information to produce the best kind of engineer. Gordon Carson, vice president of The Ohio State University, will speak and panel members will be John D. Burlie, manager, Western Electric Company; W. H.
