Some 555* University of Toledo students are candidates for graduate, baccalaureate and two-year associate degrees to be conferred at the University's fall quarter commencement ceremonies scheduled for 7:30 p.m. on Friday, December 12, in the University Field House.

Dr. William N. Free, chairman of the University's Faculty Senate and professor and chairman of the department of English, will deliver the commencement address, "In Defense of the Liberal Tradition." Dr. Glen R. Driscoll, president of The University of Toledo, will confer degrees.

Dr. Free, chairman of the Faculty Senate for the current year (1975-1976), earned his bachelor of arts and doctor of philosophy degrees at Yale University, (New Haven, Conn.) and his master of arts degree at Indiana University (Bloomington). The author of essays and books on eighteenth century English authors and poets, he has served as a member of The University of Toledo faculty since 1966.

The University's College of Law will hold its pre-commencement convocation at 4 p.m. on Friday, December 12, in the Law Center auditorium. Charles L. Levin, justice of the Michigan Supreme Court, will address the convocation.

Candidates include 11 for the doctor of philosophy degree, 4 for the doctor of education degree, 16 for the degree of education specialist which requires a year of graduate study in education beyond the master's degree, 37 for the doctor of jurisprudence degree, 124 for the master's degree, 291 for the bachelor's degree and 72 for the associate degree.

Miss Cassel is clinical director with the Court Diagnostic and Treatment Center in Toledo; Mr. Ratliff is superintendent of the Sandusky County School System; and Mr. Tombaugh is director of finance with the Sylvania Board of Education.

William D. Ogden, Jr. (175 North Sandusky St., Tiffin, O.), a candidate for the bachelor of science degree in civil engineering, and Daniel W. Rodebaugh (7441 Sylvania Ave., Sylvania, O.), a candidate for the bachelor of business administration degree, also are candidates for commissions as second lieutenants in the U.S. Army Reserve, the result of successful completion of the University's ROTC program. The commissions will be awarded at 1 p.m. on Friday, December 12, in the ROTC Armory.

The University of Toledo holds four commencement ceremonies each year, at the end of the fall, winter, spring and summer quarters.
