The University of Toledo's twenty-second annual "Honors Day," the only University-wide recognition of UT students who have attained noteworthy scholastic achievement, will be held Wednesday, June 5, at 11 a.m. in UT's Doermann Theater.

UT President Glen R. Driscoll will recognize the special award winners and Harold Shaffer, UT associate professor of biology, director of nursing education and president of the Toledo Chapter of Phi Kappa Phi, national scholastic honor society, will present the presidents of the honor societies which are sponsoring "Honors Day." The presidents then will present the 1973-74 initiates of their honor societies.

Clifford H. Copass and Bruce W. Weide will receive the "Phi Kappa Phi Scholar of the Year" award, Elizabeth R. Raniele will receive the "Phi Kappa Phi Junior Award" and Bert Michalczyk and Douglas J. McKimm will receive the "Phi Kappa Phi Sophomore Award."

This year 10 faculty members, 29 graduate students and 88 undergraduates will be initiated into Phi Kappa Phi for a total of 127 1973-74 initiates, one of the largest groups that ever has been initiated into the Toledo Phi Kappa Phi chapter.

"Honors Day" is sponsored by Phi Kappa Phi in cooperation with Alpha Epsilon Delta, Alpha Kappa Delta, Alpha Pi Mu, Beta Alpha Psi, Beta Gamma Sigma, Eta Kappa Nu, Kappa Delta Pi, Phi Alpha Theta, Phi Eta Sigma, Pi Delta Phi, Pi Gamma Mu, Pi Lambda Theta, Pi Mu Epsilon, Pi Tau Sigma, Rho Chi Society, Sigma Pi Sigma, Sigma Xi and Tau Beta Pi.

The UT chapter of Phi Kappa Phi also is sponsoring its annual banquet in the Student Union auditorium at 6:30 p.m. on June 5. The Phi Kappa Phi officers for the 1974-75 academic year will be installed at the banquet. They are: Eugene Shinavar, associate professor in general education, president; Lloyd Lapp, associate professor of history, vice president; Dr. George Taoka, professor of business economics, secretary-treasurer; and, Dr. Jesse R. Long, professor of journalism, public relations officer.

Emeritus life membership awards will be given to Dr. Carroll Amos, UT professor of mathematics; Dr. Robert F. Jackson, UT professor of mathematics; and Dr. Boris E. Nelson, professor of humanities, director of fine arts and director of University convocations.

Dr. Driscoll will introduce the speaker, Dr. Robert S. Sullivant, UT executive vice president, who will address the group on "The New Learning." Dr. Archie N. Solberg, executive director of Phi Kappa Phi and UT vice president for research until his retirement in 1971, also will speak. ###
