I am particularly interested to note your reference to the name of Canaday. My first knowledge of my Canaday ancestors in the country was in the 1600s at Jamestown. My father, who was born in Indiana, had a brother named Henry Canaday, so there might well be some connection which would be interesting to trace. Their father was named Nathan Canaday and lived near a little village of Hillsboro, Indiana, not far from New Castle, Indiana, where I was born.
