The University of Toledo's nearly 30,000 alumni have been invited to Homecoming, Saturday, Oct. 25, an annual event for alumni which this year will carry the Bicentennial theme in the traditional parade which starts at 10 a.m.

President Glen R. Driscoll will be grand marshal of the parade which will proceed west on Bancroft to Secor, north on Secor to Central, east on Central to Cheltenham, and south on Cheltenham back to the main campus.

The major buildings on the main campus will be open from 10:30 a.m. to 1 p.m. for alumni to fashion their own do-it-yourself tour of the facilities.

The Big Top will be open from noon to 1:15 p.m. to serve hot dogs and beverages to ticket-holding alumni. The tent will be located in the field north of Parks Tower and south of the Ottawa River. It is expected that about 6,000 hot dogs will be served in the 75 minutes that the tent is open.

Football will follow at 1:30 p.m. in the Glass Bowl with the Rockets playing Ohio University.

A goal-post party will be held for alumni and students following the game. The Randy Richey Trio will play for dancing at the event to be held in the south cafeteria in the Student Union.

Alumni also are invited to a student-sponsored dance from 9 p.m. to 1 a.m. in the Student Union auditorium. Maynard Ferguson and his 13-piece jazz band will play for the semi-formal event. Alumni admission is \$7 a couple and may be paid at the door.
